

# THE AILEY SCHOOL 2010 SUMMER INTENSIVE PROGRAM

The Ailey School is very pleased to offer a Summer Intensive Program every year that gives motivated students the opportunity to study dance in an exciting professional environment in NYC. The Program is for students between the ages of 16 and 25 who have had a minimum of three years of consistent training. The Ailey School is located in the Theater District, the cultural heart of New York. Summer in New York City explodes with cultural activity and the School's central location makes the special and exciting array of New York City's finest drama, dance and music easily accessible to our students. **The 2010 Summer Intensive Program will be held June 21, 2010 to July 30, 2010. The cost of the 2010 Summer Intensive Program will be announced in December 2009.**

## THE CURRICULUM

**Our School's Summer Intensive is structured to advance the technical skills of our students in a wide variety of techniques.** Students are required to take 12-15 technique and workshop classes weekly, which include a daily ballet class, a daily class of Horton and/or Graham-based modern, with additional classes in jazz, Dunham technique, hip-hop tap, and either a repertory or an elective workshop. To strengthen your bodies, body conditioning, yoga and barre a terre classes are also offered. In addition, men's ballet, women's ballet and two levels of pointe will be offered for students with strong ballet training. Intermediate and advanced students may also take ballet partnering and modern partnering. Students may also choose from several elective workshops offered each summer for students of all levels. Depending on the year, we have offered Musical Theater Dance, Caribbean Dance, East Indian Dance, or West African Dance. Intermediate/advanced students may also audition for repertory workshops that culminate in studio performances at the end of the summer session.

## REPERTORY WORKSHOPS

Every summer we offer several repertory workshops that use a range of different techniques to offer performing experience to our more advanced students. Previous summer's guest choreographers have been: **PEDRO RUIZ; CORNELIUS CARTER; DARRELL MOULTRIE; RICHARD AMARO; FRED MANN; and TROY POWELL.** The choreographers/teachers choose dancers for their repertory workshops at an audition held during the first week. Workshops culminate in exciting studio performances at the end of the summer.

## PLACEMENT AUDITIONS AND SCHEDULING

In order to determine proper technique levels, all students must take mandatory placement classes **the first week of the program beginning promptly at 9:00AM.** No latecomers will be admitted to the program so please keep this in mind when making your travel arrangements.

## CLASS SCHEDULES

After the proper technique levels have been determined during our placement classes, the Faculty Advisors give each student in the Summer Intensive Program an individualized schedule of 12 to 15 technique classes including a required daily ballet class, and a required daily modern technique (Horton and/or Graham-based modern). Students may take 5 additional classes in the other technique and somatic courses offered, as well as choose one elective repertory workshop. The Ailey School makes every effort to give students their first choice of classes, however, because of the popularity of our program enrollment in some classes is contingent upon class size limitations and availability. We advise students to have a second and third choice of elective classes so that they will not be disappointed.

## REPERTORY WORKSHOPS AUDITION REQUIREMENTS AND PARAMETERS

Minimum technique levels are required for all repertory workshops. Minimum levels are determined in conjunction with the School Director according to the choreographer's needs. Auditions for repertory workshops take place at the end of the first week (after placement classes and scheduling) and only students who have completed their registration, have paid in full, and meet the technique requirements will be allowed to audition. While all students may not meet the eligibility requirements, the School makes every effort to offer the widest range of performance opportunities to as many students as possible by offering several other elective workshops that do not require an audition.

## **ADMISSION**

Students may be accepted by either successfully passing an audition **OR** by submitting for staff review an Application Form, \$20 application fee, and two photographs in specified dance **positions** (**tendu a la seconde and arabesque for women; sautee and tilt for men**), and a DVD demonstrating the applicants ability in both ballet and modern (*see DVD guidelines below*).

- **Ballet: center floor-grand adagio; through space – petit allegro and grand allegro**
- **Modern: adagio, allegro; floor work and spatial work**
- **Solo: standard or original repertory, using modern, ballet, or jazz technique.**

**Note: Each segment should be no longer than three minutes. Candidates must be in the school Dress Code.**

Deadline for applying by application is April 1. Students do not have to submit a DVD and photographs if they plan to audition in person. Students who are not United States citizens should contact JoAnne Ruggeri, our International Student Advisor at [jruggeri@alvinailey.org](mailto:jruggeri@alvinailey.org), for information on how to obtain a student visa for the Summer Intensive and our other full-time programs.

## **TUITION DEPOSIT DEADLINES**

Acceptance to the Summer Intensive does not guarantee you a space in the program. Because there are a limited numbers of spots available, enrollment is on a first come-first serve basis. If you wish to reserve your place in the program, you must send in a **non-refundable \$300.00 deposit** with the enclosed Tuition Deposit form within two weeks of receipt of your acceptance letter. There is an additional \$20 audition/application fee, a \$50.00 Registration fee and a \$35.00 Physical Therapy Services fee (all fees are non-refundable). **THE BALANCE OF TUITION\* AND FEES MUST BE PAID IN FULL BY FRIDAY, MAY 28, 2010.** *Students will not be admitted to class until all fees are paid and a current Health Form signed by a physician, and proof of health insurance coverage have been submitted.* ***\*Tuition is subject to change.***

## THE AILEY® SCHOOL AUDITION PROCEDURE

**AUDITION REQUIREMENTS:** Criteria for acceptance include an advanced-beginner to intermediate level training in ballet and modern; a toned, flexible, well-proportioned body; musicality. The Ailey School recommends that students have a minimum of 3 years consistent dance training in ballet and modern in order to be a seriously considered candidate for acceptance.

**REGISTERING FOR AN AUDITION:** Applicants may register for an audition and pay a \$20 audition fee by following the links on the “Admissions” page of The Ailey School website. Applicants can also print an audition form from the web site and bring this to the audition. There is no need to bring a resume or head shot to the audition.

**AUDITION PROCESS:** The audition will consist of a ballet class and a Graham-based modern or Horton class. Students should bring ballet shoes to the audition. The Audition Panel will describe our programs at the audition site, as well as provide printed school materials.

**DRESS CODE:** Dancers should be dressed in neat, professional looking dance attire (i.e.: leotard and tights for women; tee shirt and tights for men). Women’s hair should be neat and pulled back away from the face.

**ACCEPTANCE:** Students will be informed of their acceptance to the program at the audition. **Acceptance letters, housing information and registration instructions will be mailed to those accepted within two weeks of the audition date.** If you have any questions after receiving your acceptance letter, you may call the Ailey School Admissions Office at 212-405-9513.

**FINANCIAL AID:** It is recommended that students apply for financial aid as early as possible. Information on the financial aid application process can be found on the “Financial Aid” page of The Ailey School web site. To request an application for financial aid, please contact the Financial Aid Director, Sally Lelong at (212) 405-9535.

**REGISTRATION AND PLACEMENT CLASSES:** Registration and placement classes take place one week before the start of the fall and spring semesters, and during the first week of the summer program. All students must register in person and take placement classes at The Ailey School before they will be admitted to class. Registration information will be sent to all those accepted within two weeks of the audition. Calls regarding registration may be directed to the Admission Office after all written information has been carefully read.

**ADVANCE TUITION DEPOSITS:** A \$300.00 **advance deposit** must be sent in order to reserve your place in the program after you have been accepted. Deadlines for payments will be detailed in your acceptance letter. Your deposit will be applied towards the tuition total.
